STREETS:

POLICE:

Cop was in town looking for someone. Strange man walked into house on Walnut, when spotten took off and ran through Grebner's yard and ran toward 89.

Heather went over Tokyo Marine Audit – there was nothing concerning.

Caden to keep a hydrant history, when repaired/oiled/ect.

There was discussion of playground maintenance with a check list. Will reach out to Stan what Grant Park does.

New Business:

82 acre solar farm going up behind grade school. Public hearing held 10.19.23 at Marshall County Courthouse. There was discussion that roads would not sustain weight of trucks, residents don't want panels in their back yard. Steve is willing to send letter of concern to board meeting to support the village as well as Merle and Kevin to represent the town.

Old Business:

Alvin spoke with Charlie Kennell but didn't get far. Hole needs filled and building front needs fixed. Letter to be sent from Colt. Original discussion included: wall could remain, fill in the hole – bid by Chad Hare was \$1100 – Charlie said no to the bid, for that price would do himself. If call comes down cannot use TIF money as it's not original part of the building. Colt will consult an Engineer route and get declaration of hole as a nescience. Village as agreed to fill hole, bring in Engineer, and put lean on property.

Krowlek situation to be fully resolved 9/18/23

Colt to send a letter to 401 Adams Street with full detail of fines – declare a nuisance (village will board up windows and clean up but send residence bill), Engineer route would be complete demo.

Eihlers property – an ordinance in 1995 was put in place to declare property rights to ally ways to village. Eihlers stating unaware – Colt to amend situation since there was missing measurements. New ordinance is Ord 2023-02, all ayes, ordinance passed.

Alvin made a motion to go back into regular session seconded by Randy. Alvin made a motion to move Tim into a Supervisor at full-time at 40 hours with benefits and Heather at 32 hours/week with benefits – Seconded by Becky. All Ayes.
